



## WARMUP #1A (JHW-01A) - 1-6-2-5 - BASIC ARPEGGIOS (VERSION 3)


- ~ This warmup gives you a basic progression and then modulates to a 5th away
- ~ If modulating is too tricky, don't do it just play the first 16 bars of any page over and over. If the warmup doesn't challenge you enough, try figuring out the pattern that lets you modulate to additional keys (hint: it's in the last 4 bars of any of these pages)
- ~ If you need more time to regroup for modulating, make the last 4 bars of each page as slow as you need to.
- ~ For lever harp, change the levers during the last 4 bars of each page (hint, you can leave out the left hand to make that easier)
- ~ If you need to change the octave of any measure because your harp is small, that's fine. These are just CHORDS, they don't live in a particular octave so play them in the octave that fits best on your instrument and in your mind.




**NOTICE THE KEY CHANGE!** This section helps you modulate to the next key. This section helps you modulate to the next key. The chords are a variation on the "2-5" of the new key (don't worry if you don't know what that means ... yet). Lever Harps: use the RH arpeggios to change your levers - or leave out the LH (or the last 2 notes of each measure) so you can change levers.



## Key of F - Level 1 (& 2)







## **Intermediate & Advanced**
